## <u>Dihlabeng Christian School</u> <u>Feeding Scheme - June 2018</u>

We are pleased to bring you news of the Feeding Scheme at DCS this year, 2018. As before, the scheme is being managed by Howard and Suzanne Kirby, volunteers at DCS from Lewes, Sussex. The Feeding Scheme this year supplies 36 children with either breakfast and lunch, or just lunch. The menu for the children's food each day remains the



same this year. It is a fairly balanced menu and gives the children chicken, minced beef, sausages and eggs as well as maize, rice, potatoes, tomatoes, cabbage and beans and very nice homemade bread. The children also have fresh milk supplied by a nearby farm, at a very reduced price. Sometimes seasonal fruit is available too.

Howard and Suzanne do an excellent job at managing the budget and are always looking for the most economic way to source the food, preferably locally. Recently, Howard spoke to several food shops, including those in the township. When he spoke to the Antsh General Trading Store in Clarens, Xiau Yun Chen who runs the store, asked him to give her a list of all the food he regularly bought and said that she would quote him a price. She came back with a really good deal and said she would provide the food for the school at less than the retail price. He has now been buying all the food from her, apart from the mince and sausages (Russians) which are bought at Ciglars store in Bethlehem, our nearest large town.

Following the re-fit of the kitchen last year we were in need of a new fridge and freezer. The old one had been leaking water over the floor for a while. The fridge was bought from Bethlehem, from a store called Masons. This is owned and run by a lovely Muslim doctor. He didn't have a small chest freezer but offered to 'give' the school his son's freezer as he didn't need it anymore and then delivered the two, that day, for free! A real blessing. The addition of the freezer has made the buying and storage of the meat so much easier, saving on time and cost of fuel to shop for the food. We were also able to

purchase two water boilers with the money saved on the freezer - one for the kitchen, and one for the staff room. Below are some photos of the children with Tshepiso and Nthabiseng, our cook and assistant, and enjoying their lunch together.
