Kathy Prosser has been an active member of Christ Church for many years.

She has worked for Christ Church Downend as Pastoral Coordinator/Parish Safeguarding Officer (2013-2015), Head of Ministry of Wholeness, Pastoral Care, Safeguarding (2015-June 2017) and is currently a Chaplain with specific ministry in local sheltered/residential homes and links into local hospitals.

What does being a chaplain mean to you?

The core of my understanding of chaplaincy is Ezekiel 34:15-16 "I will search for the lost, bring back the strays. I will bind up the injured, strengthen the weak...and then I will shepherd the flock with justice."

I believe to be a chaplain is to be a tangible, visible example of Christ's compassion for those who suffer and who are on the margins of both society and of Church; to be someone who represents the compassion of the Church to these people.; to notice the signs of God's kingdom and to encourage others I believe that a chaplain is someone who brings hope to others in all circumstances.

What do you enjoy most about your chaplaincy role?

I enjoy meeting with people of all walks of life, encouraging them in diverse and creative ways to encounter the love of God.

I meet people, families and employed carers through visits to their home, visits to local residential and sheltered homes, offering them counsel, communion services, anointing with oil and prayer, particularly at times of end of life.

One day is never the same as the next. I value being in the company of another, listening to their story and being affected and changed by this.

In this, I experience the presence of God in community.





What is your purpose behind bringing home communion to people?

I have been taking home communion to people for 6 years and I coordinate visits by the whole home communion team.

It is possible for people through changes of physical health, mental health, hospital admission or social circumstances, to lose contact with the community of the Church.

Home communion plays a pivotal role in building relationship between the gathered and the scattered Church. It is like a bridge which enables those who feel isolated from the Church to once again feel part of the family of God, of which we are all members.

People often comment on the significance and spiritual encouragement offered through home communion. Some have rediscovered Christian faith while others speak of coming to a new experience of faith.

You are also a Spiritual Director. What does this mean to you?

Spiritual direction is the encounter of God, as one person accompanies another in a journey of spirituality.

For me, it is a privilege to sit with, listen to the story of a person's life/ spirituality, reflect on and notice how God is present in that story.

At all times, God directs the accompaniment.
