

## **“The Greatest Stories Ever Told” – Jesus’ parables and how to live as Kingdom people.**

Jesus’ teaching was often delivered through parables: stories about everyday things from which we can draw a parallel to a spiritual truth about how to live and what God is like. We have to work a bit harder today to understand scenarios which would have been completely familiar to Jesus’ listeners, but which are far removed from suburban British 21<sup>st</sup> century life. Often Jesus’ stories caught his listeners by surprise as the ending or the moral was not what they expected to hear. Jesus’ parables are stories that challenge us too, often turning our own values or those of our society upside down. Rather than trying to explain what each part of a parable is meant to represent, since even scholars contest them hotly, perhaps in the end a better question to ask is, “What do I learn about God here? What do I learn about myself and the culture I live in?”

Jesus often introduced these very practical stories with the phrase, “The Kingdom of God is like...” Want to know what it would look like in your home, your street, your workplace, your school, your heart and mind, if God was fully in charge? If his ways were fully lived out; if his plans were fully carried out? Jesus’ parables point the way.
