This is the first Kumi Courier of 2025. In Uganda, the schools are reopening, and we hope the enrolment goes well. There is news of the 2024 P7 PLE results. The first team of the year flies out on 5 April, and we are looking forward to working at Wiggins Primary School for the first time. We are looking for volunteers to fill Team 2 in July-August and build on the foundations. Team 3, the Kumi "Express" team is in September this year, and although the trip is only 10 days, it is packed with most of the activities and experiences of a full team.

Also, although we have not been on the ground in Kumi, it does not mean we have not been active delivering support for our partners. Read on and enjoy.

Kumi Bazaar School has again topped the table for PLE success in Kumi. Bazaar is a government school, and its results are ahead of all private schools too. As Mission Direct, we can help with infrastructure, (classrooms and homes for teachers), resources and nutrition through the Porridge Fund. However, our interventions are only any use in supporting the teachers and students. The main factor for success is the commitment and enthusiasm of the teaching staff, which is passed on to the students, who in turn want to succeed. Hopefully, our participation can provide encouragement and resources, which make their task a little more manageable.

Please Sir, Can I have Some More The Porridge Fund Expands

We have taken a step of faith and have included Wiggins Primary School and Ngora School for Deaf Children in the Porridge programme. So, we have increased from two schools to four and are now providing 400 bowls of porridge each day. **This is £20 per day or about £4,800 per year.** That is just short of 100,000 bowls of porridge in a year.

It is well known that hunger is a major barrier to education. Since we have started providing some food for the candidate class, the exam results have improved significantly







Ngora School for Deaf Children

Charles the long time Head Teacher at NSDC, retired in March 2024. Stella Patience is the new Head Teacher, and she has arrived with a passion to achieve the best for the pupils. Deaf Children are often the last to receive the support from their families and are usually the last to be sent back to school. Although the Government pays the tuition fees, the boarding costs have to be met by the families. Although this only equates to around £240 per annum, it is a challenge many cannot meet. Stella has stepped out in faith, accepting children whose fees remain unpaid and also taking disabled children and children from the Karamoja region. Sometimes the money for food runs out and it is a struggle to feed hungry children; if you are signing all day you use more energy than a hearing child!

We are inspired by Stella and are stepping up the support for the school. Over the long Christmas break we have paid for the floors to all the classrooms to be re-laid. They were uneven and pot-holed thus dangerous for the disabled children. Thank you to Patrick and his team for completing this work. Also, we have funded the repair of beds for the dormitory.

We are also embarking on a project with the school to expand their orchard, including, as well as the fruit trees, an apiary and expanding the tree nursery. This project has so many wins in it. It provides food for the children, the tree nursery sells into the local community providing income for the school, and it is great for the environment, with new trees sustaining increased biodiversity. Thanks to the St Albans 2023 Harvest Appeal for providing the funds for this. The activity is incorporated into the children's curriculum.

We are also helping to address the hunger issues at the school. Last year we were able to give some oneoff interventions; however, for 2025 we have added NSDC to the Porridge Programme, so the school will receive support on a termly basis.



Sometimes one person gets put on the heart of someone and is blessed by a gift of generosity. Congratulations to Margaret, who has passed her Primary Leaving Examinations and will now attend a specialist Secondary School for Deaf Children. Well done.





A Return to Kumi Prison

During 2023, we unfortunately had to suspend our visits to Kumi Prison. It was unfortunate but sometimes a pause allows a reset and is good. Anyway, last year we were able to meet the new Officer in Charge, Ferdinand Baker, and he has proved to be committed to the welfare of his guests.


During the year, we have been able to re-enter the Prison and again share in Worship with the prisoners. These have been the usual uplifting occasions and are a very special time. We are joined by Beatrice Anyait, who leads the PAG ministry to the Prison and also by Ben Etomet, an ex-convict, who now leads a ministry for prisoner welfare, and their participation makes sure nothing gets lost in translation.

We have been able to support Kumi Prison in the following ways:

- We have provided a new television and satellite decoder, (documentaries and news only).
- We have the solar power repaired and extended to the women's accommodation.
- We have installed water distribution pipework in the prison.
- We have re glazed all the broken windows to the wards to keep the rain out.
- We have replaced the roof to the kitchen.
- We have supplemented the Government Goat to make Christmas extra special.

OC Baker has kindly shared some photographs of these contributions but as they are of the inside of the prison, and this is being shared electronically I cannot include them. Use your imagination or better still come to Kumi and see for yourself!!

The prison will continue to feature in our programme for 2025 and will be the highlight of the trip for many.



Wiggins Primary School Project

These are the plans for our project at Wiggins Primary School this year. We have been working hard on the planning and pricing with Joseph from Prio Construction. He will be starting work in March to prepare the site for Team One. The good news is, that we are funded to start work and complete the sub structure but are still fundraising for the rest. The total cost of the project is £29,000; we still need £15,000
